How were you scouted for UBC and Pacific FC? In my last season with Surrey United many university coaches would come watch our league games. I was fortunate to catch the eye of UBC's head coach Mike Mosher. I was contacted and eventually was offered a great scholarship

there. For CPL, at the end of the university season there was a draft where 21 players from Canadian universities were chosen to get a chance to be a part of the selected

CPL team's pre-season camp to try to earn a professional contract. CPL coaches had been watching university games and scouting players. I was fortunate to be chosen by Pacific FC, 9th overall in the CPL draft

How did your time at Surrey United contribute to your successes so far? I am very grateful for my time at Surrey United as I started there at 5 years old and developed through the Surrey United

We ended up tying 1-1 in full time and losing in double extra time. It was a heartbreaking loss. However, I was fortunate enough that the '97 age group ended up asking me to come with them to the national tournament in P.E.I which was a great experience!
